Most of you already know all about the Children's Christmas Party but a few of you do not. We ask the school counselors from Lumberton's five elementary schools to provide us with the names of children most in need. Then, we invite over 50 children to our church for the CCP.

Once our volunteers greet the parents and check in the child, we pair each child with their special friend for the day, one of our youth. Our youth are handed a gift certificate of \$125 thanks to the generous donations from people from our church and from the community. Volunteers transport the youth and children to Walmart and back. Youth assist each child in selecting over \$100 in

much needed clothing, plus a \$20 or so toy.

Upon return to the church, a team of volunteers removes tags from clothing so it will not be returned. They organize each child's purchases plus a Bible, a ham, and a stocking full of treats while our youth and they children play together on the church playground. Afterward, they enjoy pizza and cookies together and finish the morning with a movie that tells the Christmas story.

It is one of the best things we do as a youth group and one of the most cherished memories many former youth have of their time here. In fact, many college students continue to be involved for years after their time in youth. It's a wonderful day.



# Preparing for Sunday—

# "With Undivided Attention" I Thessalonians 5:16-24

The Thessalonian Christians were among Paul's favorites. He "gave thanks for them always" (1:2) but he still expected a lot from them. This Sunday's text is a list of encouragements. He challenges his friends to "rejoice always, to pray without ceasing and to give thanks in all circumstances" (16-18a). It's as if Paul thinks the Thessalonians should give their undivided attention to God. Paul's expectations may seem too high, but when we remember that he is writing about how we relate to God we realize that he is not being excessively demanding. Ponder the wonder and beauty of God and you will not want to turn away. We approach God With **Undivided Attention** not only because God deserves it, but because our joy, hope, peace and love depend on it.


