

CHILDREN'S CORNER

This past Sunday, Bo Prosser shared a meaningful sermon about listening for God's voice. As he shared his story of looking for a sign in the form of an alligator, it reminded me of an ongoing conversation I had with a friend in college. In talking about life decisions, we would always joke, "where's a burning bush when you need one?" Decisions are certainly easier when there's an audible voice telling you which way to go!

Of course, even a burning bush requires paying attention and listening in the first place. In his book *Does God Have a Big Toe?*, Marc Gellman offers a modern day midrash (a Jewish tradition of interpreting scripture through story) that suggests that the burning bush was a patience test. Gellman writes:

God caused a bush to start burning in the desert just near where some shepherds were pasturing their flocks. A few shepherds passed it and walked away. They didn't even notice that the bush was burning. but not burning up. Bushes are not special. And bushes on fire are not that special, so nobody took the time to sit long enough to watch the miracle happen. Moses, who had run away from the palace and become a shepherd, saw the bush and sat down on the ground and watched. Moses watched and watched and saw that the bush's leaves were burned off and the bush's branches were black, just like an ordinary burning bush. The only thing different about this burning bush was that it did not burn up. *It just continued to burn and burn and the branches* never fell down in a heap and the fire never went out. And Moses was the only one who waited long enough to notice.

Perhaps "burning bushes" are more common than we think, and in our busyness and distractedness we miss them. Maybe we just need to notice, to sit long enough to watch the miracle happen, and be ready to hear God's voice.
