

Preparing for Sunday . . .

"Our Yes is Greater than Our No"
Matthew 4:1-17

Jesus had barely dried off from his baptism when the Spirit led him into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. We read this passage and commend Jesus for what he resisted. It is true that Jesus showed great restraint, but isn't it also possible that Jesus was saying "yes" to something? In fact, in his baptism Jesus had said "yes" to something much greater than anything the devil had to offer. The devil's offer was not enticing to Jesus. When we remember the blessing behind us and set our eyes on the promises before us, we can say "Our Yes is Greater than Our No."





Hopefully everyone was at least mildly amused that all three of our staff articles focused on the commitments we make or don't make at the beginning of a new year. Our three perspectives mirrored our personalities and at times our advice seemed almost contradictory. That's not necessarily a bad thing. Set goals, or don't. God made each of us differently and as we age

and learn ourselves better, we know how to get the most out of our gifts and abilities.

We should listen to a variety of voices and prayerfully consider our options before taking on major changes in our lives. Currently, many of our high school seniors are struggling to choose between colleges and universities. Each has its own list of pros and cons.

My advice is that they pray and do their own research. Of course, I also often put in a good word for Appalachian State but I admit bias. They need to read all they can about rankings. They need to read reviews from former students, both positive and negative. They need to look at the price tag and they need to tour the campus. They need to listen to their parents (who are usually paying the bills), other adults in their lives, older friends who have experienced a few semesters and of course their hearts. Sometimes a school has the right academics, but is the wrong fit. Some schools are perfect for the student, but wrong for their major.

Choosing a school is difficult but important. So is choosing a church. When someone visits our church, what do they experience? What are the first things they see (depending on their entrance point)? How are they greeted? If they stay, what is expected of them in year one? In the years that follow? Will both the church and the member (if they join) become better due to their union?

After a positive deacon retreat and an uplifting deacon ordination and installation service, I am optimistic concerning our future. We feel more like a team using the same playbook than we used to. So, as individuals and as a church, let's be all we can be in 2019.
