If you like books that are easy to read but challenging to apply, take a look at Everybody Always by Bob Goff. Goff, an attorney, law professor and diplomat, challenges us to move past agreeing with Jesus to doing what Jesus said.

Most of us have studied the teachings of Jesus for years, and we attempt to follow Jesus, but Goff encourages us to strengthen our intent in loving everybody we meet, no matter how difficult they attempt to be. Each chapter includes a story of Goff's effort to love as Jesus loved. Goff is right to challenge us to be more intentional about doing as Jesus tells us to do, and he is right that many of us know the life of Jesus well.

Over the course of my study of Jesus, I have realized the more I know of him, the more I want to know. The more I know, the more committed I am to following him. This said, I am inviting you to a series of discipleship conversations on Wednesday nights on the life and teachings of Jesus. This is the second half of a series I started last fall from Martin Thielen's book, What's the Least I Can Believe and Still Be a Christian? Last fall we looked at commonly held assumptions that we do not have to believe in order to be Christian. Over the next few weeks, we will look at the essentials, what we do need to believe, and each belief is centered on Jesus. We will talk about Jesus' identity, priority, grace, work, example, death and resurrection and what each means for us today.

We can never learn enough about Jesus. In him, Paul wrote, *all the fullness of deity lives in bodily form* (Col. 2:9). Moreover, the only Jesus our neighbors may ever see is in our obedience to his command to love as we have been loved. Chances are very good that you have to deal with some "difficult people" (Goff's word) on a daily basis. It's hard to love them much less like them, but maybe if we spend some time listening to the life of Jesus these Wednesday nights, we will be a little more able to love the way Jesus loved.

"Keep Reading" Matthew 2:1-23

In this Sunday's scripture the magi arrive at the nativity. The scene is complete but the story is nowhere close to finished. Once the magi leave, Joseph is told to take his family to Egypt in order to escape the murderous threats of King Herod. It's tempting to stop reading with the return of the magi, but doing so denies the reason Jesus came into the world. As we read on we learn that Jesus did not come to receive gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. He came to right injustice and to redeem the sins of the world. We cannot close our eyes to the problems of the world in which we live. If we are going to follow Jesus we need to *Keep Reading* until we get to the redemptive end.
