Preparing for Sunday . . .

Did You Think You Could Just Show Up? Matthew 22:1-14

A recent guest to our pulpit described parables as "stories with a punch." This is an apt description of Matthew's telling of Jesus parable of the wedding banquet. Jesus told of a King who threw a wedding feast for his son. The problem was no one wanted to come to the party. The invitees not only declined the invitation, they murdered the servants who came to tell them the party was ready. The King responds with all-out war and then sends out an open invitation to any and all who will come to the party. Eventually, the room is full and the party is on! The King is pleased until he notices a man who was not wearing a wedding robe. He is so upset that he has the man thrown into "the outer darkness." This parable has plenty of punch and perhaps the most important lesson for us is to remember that when we accept God's invitation to come to the party, we need to do more than just show up!

again. It really doesn't matter that it wasn't within our shores. Anytime a racist terrorist enters a house of worship and slaughters innocent men, women and children, we should feel a wide range of emotions. I am not so sure we care anymore though. We have accepted shootings such as the one that took place in Christchurch, New Zealand as a normal part of life. We see the news of the devastation and feel a moment's pity and then go on our way filling our basketball brackets and planning this weekend's picnic.

Forgive my cynicism but the list that includes Columbine, Sandy Hook, Virginia Tech, Orlando, and Las Vegas is getting longer and longer. It will not end until we make a systemic effort to treat mental illness and limit the access to weapons that do not belong in public settings. These are complex questions that demand conversation, understanding and courage to answer, but we must do something to end the violent loss of life.

I am proud that our church is taking a proactive approach to addressing security concerns. Last year, the Deacons appointed a committee to form a Security Policy and Action Plan for the church and ECM. This has been a tremendous task, but the committee has done a superb job in researching all related topics and putting together a policy that establishes a reasonable and necessary response to all emergencies. Lisa Rust, chair of the committee, presented an overview of the policy to the deacons at our last meeting. The Deacons were then emailed a copy of the policy draft and were asked to read through it and be prepared to discuss it at the April meeting. The policy is thorough, but it is a living document in that it will be reviewed each year and may have to be amended from time to time. The consensus among the Deacons is that it is sad we have to give time and energy to this topic. We'd rather be focusing on the ministry of the church and we will, but this is an important issue that demands our attention.

The recommendation from the Security Committee includes the request for upgrades in our monitoring and alarm systems, first aid equipment and various other expenses. The committee or I will be informing you of these upgrades and possible emergency training events in the weeks ahead.

Once the Deacons approve the policy we will send a copy of it to you via email. As I said above, it is unfortunate that we have to spend time and money on these concerns, but we must. As we do, let's be safe, pay attention to our surroundings and be prepared to respond to any and all emergencies.




