Sunday, April 14, 2019 3:00 pm First Baptist Fellowship Hall



Preparing for Sunday . . .

"Cleaning House" Matthew 21:1-17

Few things made Jesus angrier than for someone to stand in the way of helpless person who wanted to speak to him. The merchants and the moneychangers were prohibiting people's access to the temple, the presence of God. Once Jesus "dismissed" the merchants, blind and lame individuals appear and he healed them. People with physical problems as these were thought to have been cursed by God, so it was scandalous for Jesus to give them access to the temple. Jesus cleaned house so the "riff-raff" could come in! The temple cleansing teaches us that we need to constantly clean house of attitudes, prejudices and biases that keep people from God.

We are "in the short rows" now. This Sunday is Palm Sunday and next Sunday is Easter, so our Lenten journey is nearly complete. I'll confess that I got a little lost along the way. I am having a "good lent" but I wish I had been more consistent with my prayers, devotions and journaling. I am trying to get back on course and Richard Rohr helped me this week. Father Rohr directs of the Center for Action and Contemplation in New Mexico and publishes a daily devotional via the web. I want to share the devotion he wrote for March 31<sup>st</sup> entitled "Dying Before You Die" because he captures an essential element of the Lenten season.

"Sooner or later, if you are on any classic "spiritual schedule," some event, person, death, idea or relationship will enter your life with which you simply cannot cope using your present skill set. Spiritually speaking, you will be led to the edge of your own private resources. At that point, you will stumble over a necessary, "stumbling stone." This is the only way that God can get you to change and go on the further and longer journey. We must stumble and fall, I am sorry to say. We must be out of the driver's seat for a while, or we will never learn how to give up control to the Real Guide. Until we are led to the limits of our present game plan and find it to be insufficient, we will not search out or find our real Source. Jesus calls this Ultimate Source the "living water" at the bottom of the well.

The Gospels teach us that life is tragic but then graciously added that we can survive and will even grow from this tragedy. This is the great turnaround! It all depends on whether we are willing to see down as up. Julian of Norwich put it well... 'first there is the fall, and then we recover from the fall – and both are the mercy of God.'"

No one likes to face the thought of stumbling and falling. But, life happens to all of us and asking for help is vital. Even Jesus fell while carrying the cross! We must accept our limits and depend on God to pick us up, brush us off and send us on our way again. I know of no more important Lenten lesson than this and I appreciate your prayers and encouragement as I learn to "die before I die" so that I may one day truly live.
