


Join us in celebrating our risen Lord by placing fresh cut flowers on the cross in front of the church as we gather at First Baptist on Sunday.

# Preparing for Sunday . . .

"Travel Light" Matthew 28:1-10

Mary Magdalene and "the other Mary" are the first to witness the resurrection in Matthew's gospel. They are met by an angel who has rolled the stone away. The angel sends the women to tell the disciples to meet Jesus in Galilee. As they leave the tomb they go "with fear and great joy."
