Over the past couple of years I have dedicated our Wednesday night bible study to a specific topic or bible book that I have long been interested in, but never found the time to adequately study. Two years ago we looked at the life of Peter and last

year we surveyed Revelation. This year I am looking forward to making my way through Acts. I believe the first days of the church could teach us some valuable lessons for how to practice our faith individually and as a family of faith today.

As you may know, the person who wrote the gospel of Luke is credited with writing Acts as well. In Luke, the writer wanted to give "an orderly account" of the life of Jesus "so you may know the truth concerning the things which you have been instructed," (Luke 1:3-4). Luke had similar intent with Acts in that he wanted to inform his reader(s) of how the Holy Spirit was connected to Jesus and how the Spirit directed and empowered the disciples to extend the gospel's reach around the world.

In both the gospel and Acts, Luke writes to "Theophilus." Scholars are not completely sure if this was a specific person or, if it was a general audience. The name Theophilus literally means "one who loves God," so if you are a Theophilus, I invite you to join us for dinner, fellowship and good conversation about what the Spirit did in the early days of the church and what the Spirit desires to do today.
