### Preparing for Sunday . . .

#### "All Along" Acts 13:1-3; 14:8-18

In this text, Barnabas and Paul are on a mission trip to Lystra. When Paul heals a man who'd never walked, he and Barnabas are thought to be Greek gods. The two quickly speak up to correct the misunderstanding. Paul gives an impassioned speech to tell the people that the God who created the heavens, earth and sea and who has supplied them with food and joy had allowed them to follow their own ways was making Himself known. God was with them *All Along* even when they did not know it. We need to hear Paul's message and repeat it!




James is one of the first books of the Bible I really came to know. My interest in the letter started at Southern Seminary. The school's motto was *Be Doers of the Word*, a phrase taken from James 1:22. I have read through the four chapter letter several times and found a couple of other interesting passages. I like James 4:10 which says "humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you." I also liked the foreboding counsel of James 4:13-16 that admonishes us to not be overly confident about the length of our lives. In verse 14 James asks "What is your life?" and then says "for you are a mist that appears for a little while and then vanishes."

I wrote on death in last week's article and I would like to move on to happier topics, but in the wake of several deaths, I cannot let go of James' words. Since the deaths of two acquaintances last week, I have learned of the deaths two dear church members; D.E. Ward, Jr. and Janis Biggs; author, Rachel Held Evans; and George Moore, a longtime friend in my former church. D.E., Janis and George lived long, good lives. They raised their families and made faithful contributions to the good of their communities. Rachel was 37 years old and the mother to two small children. She too made a great contribution to her community. It is not too bold of a statement to say that of her generation, Rachel Held Evans did more to help the church become Christian than anyone else.

Of D.E., Janis, George, and Rachel no one would argue that Rachel's life best fits James' analogy of life as a quickly vanishing mist. Still, all who come and go from this life do so quickly. The Psalmist wrote "the days of our life are seventy years, or perhaps eighty if we are strong; even then their span is only toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away," (Psalm 90:10).

The frailty of life may be a depressing thought, but James, D.E., Janis, George and Rachel would encourage us to take another look. Life is a mist, so live it to the fullest, they would say. Don't be so bold to think you can put off living for another day. If there is a good you need to do, do it. If there is an opportunity you need to take, take it. If there is a mercy you need to share, share it. If there is a brokenness you need to mend, mend it. If there is a wrong you need to right, right it. Life is a mist and whether it lingers for 37 or 98 years, the worst possible thing is for it vanish with a good deed left undone or a kind word left unsaid.
