In this season where many of us are spending extra time at home or extra time alone, it provides a great opportunity to add in a little extra prayer and devotional time to our schedules. To help with that, each week, we'll be sharing a spiritual discipline or practice to try. This week's practice is *lectio divina* (translated "divine reading"), which is a way of praying with scripture. The purpose of lectio divina is not to academically study and analyze a passage, but to reflect personally on scripture and listen for God's voice. Instructions are below:

Preparation

Begin by finding a comfortable and quiet place to sit, and silence your phone. Decide what passage of scripture you'd like to use – no longer than 15 verses is best. Pray, "God, help me to hear your voice." Spend a minute or two in silence.

Lectio (Read)

Slowly read the passage. As you read, see if there is a word or phrase that jumps out at you. Don't force it or analyze it; simply see what words catch your attention.

Meditatio (Reflect)

Slowly re-read the passage, focusing in on the word or phrase that jumped out at you. Then, take a few minutes to reflect on what you believe God may be saying to you through that phrase in this text.

Oratio (Respond)

Slowly re-read the passage, then spend some time responding to what you have heard in this passage. You can respond by journaling or by praying.

Contemplatio (Rest)

Slowly re-read the passage, then simply sit for a few minutes and rest in God's presence. Close in prayer.



We are living in uncertain times. Many are saying our world has suddenly become chaotic and unpredictable, but the truth is it already was. It is also fair to say the volume of chaos has been turned up quite a bit over the last few weeks. My request for you this day is to find some quiet, center yourself, and go to the Lord in prayer.


Pray for our senior adults and others whose lives are most at risk. Pray not only that they survive the virus, but that they survive the loneliness and isolation as well. Pray for the

Boomer generation, the ones whose risk is higher than most, but may still need to work in environments that expose themselves to health dangers during this time.

Pray for Generation X, as we balance concern for our elderly parents and the children still in our care. Pray for the Millennial Generation, who may be losing employment right as their careers were beginning to find traction. Pray for Gen Z, especially the class of 2020, as the only world they have known suddenly changed without warning and meaningful milestones of their lives have been lost. Pray for the youngest among us, who see and feel the anxiety their parents are experiencing, but are least equipped to process it.

Let's not blame each other for any of this. Let's love one another, for we are in it together. If we look and listen hard enough, we may see God in it with us as well.



Dear Church Family,

I am stunned by the impact of the Coronavirus, and I am sure you are as well. We face uncertainty, fear, loneliness, and each and every one of us face financial hardships at some level. Meanwhile, our church is now faced once again with a setback. For me, the greatest disappointment from the perspective of our church is that I was beginning to feel our church family was starting to gain some positive momentum under the direction of Dr. Bo Prosser. As we move forward through the uncertainty of the Coronavirus, Dr. Bo, Erin, Doug and Tim will work harder than ever to keep the framework and foundation of our church alive and well so when we emerge from this terrible disease we can re-establish our path to better and brighter days at FBC Lumberton. Meanwhile, even though the church doors are closed on Sunday mornings, the bills continue to come and the need to support missions still exists. So, we do need your continued financial support to the level you can realistically consider. Only you know your financial situation, and you should consider giving only to the level that does not place you and your family in a financial hardship during this time; but if you are able to continue giving, please consider the fact that the church needs tithes and offerings to continue providing services and support to the congregation.

We have many ways you can continue making a gift. We offer bank draft, you can mail in contributions, you can give on-line and beginning Monday, March 30th we will establish a tithing time in which you can hand deliver a financial gift to the church at a set time; between 1:00 and 2:30 each Monday. During that 1 ½ hour time period each Monday, a staff member will be at the 6th Street entrance (at the place you generally go for BBQ plate pick up) and they will meet you in your car to receive your financial gift. Just drive up, stop in that area, stay in your car, and they will come out of the church building to meet you. We realize the physical act of delivering your financial gift in person is important so we want to provide a means for you to do so while respecting the integrity of social distancing. Also, please understand that due to the nature of the situation we cannot accept cash, we will only be able to accept checks.

While we may feel down and out, I believe we are also most fortunate to have leadership from Dr. Bo and an amazing staff that have shown their worth in ways stronger than ever. There will be better days ahead and I cannot wait to see you again on Sunday mornings.
