Phone Access to Worship Services

In this time of social distancing, our worship services are currently online only. However, we know there are some in our congregation who do not have internet access or computer/smartphone access, and we have been researching other ways to share our worship services.

While it wouldn't be the complete worship service, we have found a a way for people to call in on any phone line and listen to our sermon recordings. There is a catch, though: the number you would call is an out of state phone number, so if your phone plan charges you for long distance calls, your phone company would charge your for that call. While not perfect, this is the best option we have found thus far.

Don't go to the store just so you can have special bread and juice. The significance of this moment is tied not to what you consume, but to the story which is told and remembered.
- Take out your communion elements before worship begins and set them aside where you can easily access them. Dr. Bo will lead us in communion after the sermon.


A brief devotion offered by Bo Prosser will be live-streamed on Facebook.


