
#### Your Responses have been so Encouraging!

The Bylaws require two things...

- 1. That any loan be approved by the church in conference. While most if not all of this will be a grant, it is still considered a "loan" and to meet the letter of the law, we need church approval.
- 2. That a physical church conference must take place. There are no provisions in the bylaws for a totally virtual meeting. So, there will be less than ten people in a physical meeting (which meets the bylaws) and the rest of you will discuss and vote virtually.

Again, we just need to have guidance from the church in an official capacity as we move forward. All is well! Thanks be to God!
