



Greetings from your Pastor Search Team,

Your pastor search team has been hard at work since our last report to you. After a short pause when the pandemic

hit, we have been meeting regularly since August. Although our meetings have been by Zoom rather than in person, they have been productive and often we have met 2 and 3 times a week particularly since we began interviewing prospective pastors.

We have received over 120 resumes of individuals to consider as the next senior pastor of First Baptist Church, Lumberton. We are a sought-after church, and your team is committed to finding the person that God has chosen for us and not "settling" for the easy candidate. We are searching and praying for the most excellent leadership for our church!

In November and December of 2020, we spent many hours researching and interviewing several candidates. We were hopeful that one of these minsters would be ours, but each of those, for various reasons, hit a road block. Those candidates were just not meant to be our next pastor. In January of this year, the committee was again extremely hopeful about a new candidate--and just as quickly, God closed that door.

So, again, we began the process of reaching out to trusted colleagues and contacts in our CBF network to seek more resumes and referrals. This past week we interviewed five more candidates. We plan to invite several of those to engage in additional conversations and hope that they feel God is leading them to explore and learn more about our church. We feel that the disappointment with the early candidates has shown us the important issues for our church's future that should be addressed in these conversations. We are encouraged that we are more prepared for those we are speaking with now.

While we as a team are confident that God is guiding us, we are also aware that this will happen in God's timing, not ours. We are all eager for our church to have a senior pastor. While Dr. Bo has provided excellent leadership during the interim, we look forward to the time when we will have a full time pastor to guide us and provide direction. Let me assure you again, God is in control and he is preparing the one that he will call to lead us in the coming days.

Thank you for your continued prayers during this time in the life of our church. If you still have the pastor search prayer guide shared with you in the spring of 2020, let me encourage you to pull it out again and pray with us as we follow Gods lead. We have felt your support and God's hand at work

during the last few months. We will continue to keep you updated as we move forward into the next steps in the process.
