A Note from the Pastor's Desk

This month marks the beginning of our fourth month together in ministry. The time has flown by, and in our first quarter of a year together, we have experienced a little bit of everything together. One of the greatest things I have experienced is the overwhelming sense of welcome that so many of you have bestowed upon not just me, but my family. Whether it was cards in the mail, dropping off peaches or other items, helping unload boxes, sharing meals, or just your smiling faces expressing your appreciation for our being here, Lindsay, Quinn, Carter, (and yes even our dog Creek), have been so blessed by the warm welcome we have received from you all.



Being warmly welcomed when you are arriving in a new place can go a long way in helping you overcome the anxieties, fears, and challenges of adjusting to life in a new place. There are many in our world today that because of circumstances not of their own making, from everything to domestic violence to war-torn nations, have had to uproot everything they have known and move to a new place in an attempt to not only reach safety but to start a new way of life. That is why Cooperative Baptist Fellowship of NC partnered a few years ago with a program started by Marc and Kim Wyatt, CBF Field Personnel. This new missions program is called the Welcome House Community Network (WHCN). The emerging network seeks to extend Christian hospitality in the form of temporary housing and community outreach to vulnerable people in every NC city and town.



In an effort to raise awareness and funds for this mission, CBFNC Executive Coordinator Larry Hovis will be conducting a bike ride from the “capital to the coast.” Larry, an avid cyclist, along with a small team will ride from Raleigh to points east over a four-day period (Oct. 14-17), ending up in Wilmington. On Saturday (the 16th), Larry and the team will be making a stop right here in Lumberton at First Baptist! We are inviting all who can to come out and be a part of the welcome party for Larry, who will stop and make a short talk about the importance of this ministry. This day also happens to be a Community Cafe service, so CBFNC reps will be on sight early to record the work being done and to highlight this hospitable effort that coincides with the theme and work of the Welcome House mission.

I encourage all that can to be here Saturday, Oct. 16 at 11:30 AM to be a part of this exciting time as we invite others to join us in the mission and the mandate of holy welcome and embracing our vulnerable neighbors.

Proceeds raised will be used to provide seed grants to churches throughout the state to start new Welcome House ministries. Last year's inaugural Welcome Ride raised over \$20,000! - Give to the general budget.
- Volunteer to read scripture or pray as part of an upcoming worship service.
- Prayerfully consider any request from Committee on Committees to serve.
- Pray, pray, and pray some more!
