## A Note from the Pastor's Desk

How are your resolutions going so far in 2022? I have never really been one to make resolutions, but I do often consider things that I would like to improve on or new things to try when a new year rolls around. At their core, whether it is resolutions, goals, or just good intentions, these stated desires are all aimed at helping us get to a better version of ourselves. Something that we are maybe more content with, more excited about, can identify as achieving a level of success, or that brings us a sense of accomplishment.



Looking at these ideas another way, might I suggest that what we all should be striving for with these resolutions or lists is to achieve something akin to flourishing. Now "flourishing" is not a word that we use frequently in our lexicons but I think it is more in line with the desires of God for us. Flourishing is all about growing in a healthy way in the environment where you already are. This idea is seen in scripture in Psalm 92:12-14 where the psalmist writes, "But the godly will flourish like palm trees and grow strong like the cedars of Lebanon. For they are transplanted to the Lord's own house. They flourish in the courts of our God. Even in old age, they will still produce fruit; they will remain vital and green." Yet, how do we achieve flourishing? How do we grow right where God has us planted and produce fruit for our community and the world?

First, it is helpful to know what it is not. For example, flourishing is not the same thing as physical or numerical growth. We all know what kudzu is here in the South, and so we know that a roadside overgrown with it is not an environment that is flourishing despite the noticeable growth in the area. Flourishing is instead intentional growth. Jesus said in John 10:10, "I came that they may have life, and have it abundantly." In this new year, how can you intentionally grow more into who God has created you to be so that you might know the kind of abundance that God aims to provide? How might our church seek intentional growth, maybe in new or different ways to bring on the abundance of God, not abundance by human standards? I am looking at 2022 as a new opportunity to flourish as a father, as a spouse, as a minister, and for our church. How might you work in this new year to find flourishing for yourself? Let's seek it out together.

While our network is being set-up and software is being installed, we are still experiencing some hiccups resulting from the ransomware attack on our network last November. We greatly appreciate the work of our IT team as we work out the challenges of setting up several new devices and programs and ensuring our online security is up to par. One of the hiccups we are experiencing is the lack of restoration of our software programs, including ACS People. ACS People is the program we use for member records, such as easy access to addresses and phone numbers, but we also use it for entering contributions. Fortunately, we have paper records available!

Since it's the time of year when we are closing out the old year and getting ready for the upcoming year, we are also looking at a large task when it comes to getting contributions statements ready for 2021. Our Money Counters, office staff, and Financial Secretary are working together to collect information from paper records, office deposits, and online contributions to create contribution statements manually. Previously, the ACS People software made accessing giving statements easy to access with the reports feature. We are now having to go "old school" and recreate records on paper. Our goal is have your contribution statement report for you by January 31, 2022. With that being said, your report will look different that what we provided in previous years. One of the biggest changes is that only your total giving amount, instead of each gift, will be listed on your 2021 contribution statement.
