### A Note from the Pastor's Desk

It happened this year on October 21. The first Christmas-related commercial I saw aired on television. In the last few years, I have made a mental note of when I recognize my first December holiday-themed commercial. Unsurprisingly, it seems to come earlier and earlier each year.

I certainly understand the excitement and rush to celebrate Christmas. The lights, the decorations, the food, the presents... I totally get it. It is a joyous time, and who wouldn't want to squeeze as many days of it in as possible? However, the pastor-cynic in me wants to criticize liturgically-minded Christians for failing to acknowledge Advent, and the food-lover in me wants another month to enjoy "all the fall

things". The day after Halloween shouldn't mark the end of pumpkin-spice and the beginning of gingerbread and lights!

Even more than the food, the abrupt turn from Halloween to Christmas negates an entire month of a season that our American history and culture has established, Thanksgiving. Yes, it seems to me that the rush to celebrate Christmas pushes Thanksgiving to become more of a sidekick in the holiday season, or at worse, a slight bump in the road on the way to the "real fun." I think that intentionality on thanksgiving is an important practice for all of us as citizens of our great country, but it is especially important for people of faith everywhere!

There is so much to be grateful to our God for not just this month, but every day of our lives. Yet, one of the benefits of following the liturgical or church calendar is the intentional days and seasons where we give our collective attention to components of our faith. So this month, I'd like to invite you to join me in giving some intentional thought to what God has done in our lives. If we would stop and become aware of all that God has done for us, that gratitude would and should certainly compel us to respond with praise.

So to help us do that this month, I want to challenge each of us to use Psalm 145 as a way to journey through this month. We will be using a verse-a-day, beginning on Friday, November 4 through Thanksgiving Day, where I challenge you to be reading through Psalm 145. The Psalm is structured as a list of proclamations for what God has provided, or, the writer's recognition of their need to extend gratitude towards God. Each day, as you read the verse, spend your day reflecting on the words of the verse, and how it is directing you to be more aware of what God has done, is doing, and wants to do in and through your life. Spend time thinking about the ways your intentional focus on gratitude maybe changes your attitude, your awareness of things in your life, and the way you engage others. Let us spend this month, this season of thanksgiving, in gratitude and praise together! We have much to be thankful for.
