It is hard to believe that this is now the third Lenten season where a global pandemic has been a part of our daily lives. Since March 2020, we have all gained a deeper understanding of what it means to sacrifice, to let go, and to be reminded of our own mortality. Thankfully, cases and impacts seem to be on the decline, but this Lenten season of 2022 still offers yet another opportunity to go deeper in our commitment to seek God's direction in our lives. A chance to let go of the things that hold us back from experiencing God's love and presence in a deeper way.

In these last two years, we have also learned the value of being gathered together with others. We have hopefully gained a new

appreciation for what it means to be a part of a community. Whether that is with family and friends, coworkers, neighbors down the street, or the people right here in our church. We saw how vital we are to each other's social, emotional, mental, and spiritual health. We learned that not only can we do more together than we can apart, but that I need you, as much as you need me. That your neighbor, down the street or down the pew from you, needs you as much as you need them. We are stronger when we come together.

One of the Gospel passages prescribed in the Lectionary for this year's season of Lent is Luke 13:34 where Jesus says to the people of Israel, "...How often I have wanted to gather your children together as a hen protects her chicks beneath her wings..." (NLT). In that we see two things; first, Jesus expresses concern for his people and aims to comfort, protect, and guide them in the most beneficial way. Second, this concern is expressed most profoundly through the bringing together of God's people. Yes, God knows what is best for us, but God also understands that this is best achieved in community with other believers.

This Lenten season, as a church we are challenging ourselves to be "called together for the sake of transformation." In Lent, we are reminded that often what may be most needed to change in order to bring about God's desires for the world is us, our individual selves. If each of us experiences this transformation, then the Church is transformed, and thus able to go about transforming the world in which we reside. Yet as with all things under God's wings, this change is not done best alone. It happens more fully when experienced in community together. During Lent, our church is offering a variety of ways to seek transformation both individually and collectively. Opportunities such as our Lenten daily reading through the Gospel of Mark, midweek "Walk to the Cross" walking group on Wednesdays at noon, Coffee & Conversation Bible study with others at Panera Bread on Thursday mornings, or upcoming community Holy Week services with sister churches, and as always, our weekly opportunities of midweek Bible study, Sunday School, and worship. There is no shortage of opportunities to seek God's transformation in your life. And the best part is, we get to do it all with this amazing community of fellow believers under the protective wings of our Lord and savior.






### **Prayers and Support for Ukraine**
