A Note from the Pastor's Desk

Some critiques might say that paper seems a little informal, a little simple, and requires minimal effort, I've seen some of my peers make fun twists on this traditional practice, giving some creative gifts involving paper. Having my curiosity piqued, I did a quick Google search and one site I found says the gift of paper is symbolic. According to internet blogger Jessica Wilkeson, "Paper represents a blank page. It's the beginning of all great ideas, however, it needs to be added to, written on, held. Maybe even folded and creased a bit to give it some interest and make it unique...paper represents your future being written together."

It may not seem like it, but this month marks the completion of our first year together. In many ways, it seems like we just unpacked the last box, and then in other ways, it feels like this has been our home for years. As a church family, this year has seen us

But we are just getting started.

Upon further consideration of the traditional first-anniversary gift of paper, it seems profoundly appropriate for us. In our journey together with me as your pastor, we still have much left to be written. The pages of our story have many blanks left to fill in. We still have many opportunities to fold and mold these pages together into the beautiful images God is leading us to through our church and community. I am beyond grateful every day to be your pastor and give thanks to God for bringing us together. Yet I am equally excited by what is still to come. So please friends, accept this metaphorical first anniversary gift of paper from me, and let us continue to write the beautiful story of ministry and fellowship together with God as our guide.


