A Note from the Pastor's Desk

It's February 2 as I write this, and I just saw the notification on my phone that the loveable rodent that most people only think about one day a year, Punxsutawney Phil, has seen his shadow, thus ushering in six more weeks of winter. Considering the first day of spring this year is scheduled for March 20th, lucky for him, ol' Phil wasn't too far off.

This day also tends to include references to the 1993

film of a similar name, *Groundhog Day*, starring Bill Murray. In the movie, Murray's character, a weatherman set to cover the annual groundhog day festivities in Punxsutawney, PA, sees himself reliving the same day over and over. Of course, there is a love interest in the film, and over the course of the movie, Murray's character while initially a bit of a grump, sees his heart soften, his actions change, and as his luck would have it, he gets the girl and gets unstuck from the time loop.

Sometimes, our lives may feel like they are stuck in a loop, doing the same actions, or feeling the same emotions day after day. Consistency and repetition are not inherently bad, but sometimes, being stuck in the same loop of activities can limit our personal growth, as well as the chance to encounter new opportunities. The same is true for our spiritual lives with God. Often we may maintain the same routine of regular church activities, Bible reading, devotions, or TV/radio preachers and feel that we are doing fine. So whether it is in your own spiritual walk with Jesus, or in our church body, being willing to step out of the "normal routine" can bring us to spaces of new opportunity, and likely new challenges. But we trust that just as Jesus has done thus far in our lives, he too will meet us in these previously unexplored places to experience our Lord in new and exciting ways.




