Have you ever tried to explore a new shopping mall without first stopping at the directory sign? How about moving around an airport that you've never visited before? Ever been to an event, and become confused about where exactly to park, so you just go with the first open spot of grass and start from there?

Yes, navigating new or different spaces can be difficult at times, but sometimes even getting around familiar places can be a challenge. I know that for many of our older community members, one of the hardest transitions is remaining in a house that has been home for decades, but acknowledging that it was built for a younger, differently-abled version of yourself. That is why taking a hard look at our needs, and our current situations are a natural part of any person's life.

Our church body is at such a point in our lives as well in regard to our physical meeting house. Prior to my coming to begin serving as your senior pastor,

there have been many conversations, questions, and inquiries about how to make our space more user-friendly, safer to access, and functional for the church of today. I, too, have had similar conversations with many of you, and I believe that we are now at a vital time in the life of our church to consider the best use of our largest asset - our facilities and grounds.

In considering the needs of our people, there have been many solutions proposed as to what could be changed. However, I think it is helpful if we are able to fully identify what our needs are, both for our current and future church community, and consider what it would take to meet those needs in a holistic manner. Doing so will afford our church leaders the chance to make informed and impactful decisions going forward.

That is why I am happy to share with you beginning this month, that in concert with our church's deacons, we are launching what I am calling a Facilities Strategic Visioning Team (FSVT). This team is a group of people representing church-appointed officer positions and volunteers from our larger fellowship. They are tasked with a fact-finding mission, gathering opinions and needs of both current church members, but also soliciting information from folks in our broader Lumberton community to help us see what those not currently in our church may be looking for in a faith community in terms of its physical space. They will spearhead conversations and other forms of listening to our congregation, trying to compile a full picture of what our people really need/want, and then offer some larger, or big-picture possible solutions. Their end goal is a report that can be given to our church's leadership (deacons, ministry staff, finance, and building and grounds) to consider future faithful steps.

Now, I know that churches are notorious for talking about things and not doing them. I can promise you that this is not an attempt at more information, or talking, or producing a report that will just end up on a shelf somewhere, but I intend for it to be a purposeful step toward making the changes we need to in order to be an agile, active, and welcoming faith community for all. The Church is so much more than its physical address, its the people who sit in the pews who live, work, and play in the community at large. However, where we gather is an important statement to ourselves and our neighbors, and it should be used as a function of ministry, not just as a point of meeting. Our mission proclaims that we are a community that desires to show the love of Christ through our service to God and to all people, and our meeting house should be a large extension of that mission.

I ask that you join me in faithfully holding the work of this group in prayer. I also ask that you consider responding to and engaging with their efforts as you are invited to do so in the coming months. We want every voice heard, but also want to know what would make us most effective. The group's first meeting will be this Sunday, March 5th. I hope that you share in the excitement that I have for this effort, as we look forward to how God wants to continue to further the Kingdom through our little plot of that Kingdom here between 7th and 5th streets!
