

If I had the chance, I would love to invite those within our church to give me their response to the question, "What is worship?" Upon compiling the answers, I would then welcome the chance to share them with all of you, and then hear your responses to that data. If I had to guess, I would assume the responses might be quite varied, and as you read them, you might be surprised to see the many ways in which people within our own faith community understand, experience, and desire to engage in worship.

Sadly, in the last fifty years of the global Church, thoughts, opinions, and preferences around worship have dominated much of the conversation within churches. Churches have even come to the point of splitting, or

participants outright leaving altogether on account of things like drums and guitars, hymns or choruses, organ or piano, lights or stained glass windows, "suit and ties" or "jeans and flannel shirts." On and on we could go about the many aspects of worship engagement that have served as confrontations for the people of God. This is somewhat understandable when you remember that worship is one of the central components of the people of God. For many folks, it is the most significant engagement one has with their faith community or their own spiritual life. Because we associate worship with our faith, and our faith with how we see ourselves and understand the world, worship is important.

That is why I am so grateful to you, Church, for allowing us to engage with different experiences of worship this summer. For starters, we didn't gather in the sanctuary at all from Memorial Day to Labor Day. While in the fellowship hall, we incorporated elements such as PowerPoint, spoken word, and visual aids in sermons. We manipulated how we were physically present in the space, such as gathering around tables, to sitting in a circle. We adorned the space with different elements for the eye, like the various art mediums during August. Then we ended the summer by joining for worship in our chapel and got to rub elbows in the packed room. Through all of this, if you had reservations, you didn't hound the staff with them. If you were upset about something, it did not reach our ears. So for that, I want to say thank you for letting us explore and attempt to be creative with how we worship as a faith community.

Through all of these experiences, I hope you were able to see that worship is so much more than a regular routine, specific space, particular seat, or a preferred method. When we gather for worship, there are well over 100 different personalities, experiences, tastes, and learning styles gathered in the room at one time. While everything we do in worship may not be everyone's favorite, we hope that in a worship gathering, there is at least one element that connects with you and in turn facilitates a connection with the divine. Because ultimately friends, worship is not about us. It is not really about what "feeds us", what "moves us", or what "we have always done." Our worship is about the *people* of God giving praise and adoration *to* God. The worship is not done for the "audience" gathered in the pews or chairs, but the audience is really an audience of one, our Heavenly Father.

So my hope for each of us is that as we gather once more in our sanctuary and continue in our weekly worship gatherings, the central guiding principle of everything we do, the "why" behind what we do will always be on praising God in all of the ways we can. God has created each of us uniquely, and the diversity of God's creation speaks to the multitude of ways we can use the

elements of that creation to offer our praises to God. May our acts of worship, whenever, however, and wherever they occur, seek to honor God. For our Lord is worthy to be praised!

At our most recent church business meeting, it was shared how our church's leadership has recently begun the process of requesting our city officials to close the portion of 6th Street that runs between our two properties (Walnut to Pine). This would mean this section would no longer be a maintained city street and would cut out general traffic on this busy pedestrian walk for our church and ECM. It also opens up opportunities for us to reimagine accessibility and church grounds to best use our combined properties. The city council approved our request for evaluation with the city's planning department at their August 7th meeting. At the next meeting, on Sept. 11, there will be a public hearing on our request, where residents can speak in support or against our request. It would be great if those from our church were present for a visible show of support. If you are interested in attending, the meeting is on Monday, Sept. 11 at 6 p.m. at City Hall, upstairs in the council meeting room.
