Rev. Josh Owens will be leading a series entitled "Seeking the Sacred." This series comes out of some of the reading and writing he has been doing for his dissertation research, and the focus will be on how we go about determining what has been and what could be sacred places for our spiritual lives. It will focus on defining the word "sacred," how we have historically determined places we deem sacred, and challenge us to imagine what could serve as holy places in our lives and church practice.

A Note from the Pastor's Desk January 2024

With a new year upon us, it is easy to look forward with excitement to what new opportunities lie ahead of us. However, it is also important to take stock of what we have already come through. In 2023, First Baptist Church Lumberton had an exciting year in so many ways. So, I thought I would use this month's newsletter entry to recount a list of some of the things that came to my mind as I reviewed this past year. Highlights include:



- We responded to water damage on the first floor of the Cockrell Children's Building by investing in renovated and expanded facilities for our Early Childhood Ministry to enhance early childhood education in our community.
- Countless **hours of service and ministry** were completed through various groups in the church (i.e. Youth Ministry with Wednesday "Youth on Mission," Women's Ministry Union (WMU) projects, Sunday School class-specific activities, as well as other individuals and groups).
- In March we celebrated **Baptist Women in Ministry Month of Advocacy**, with ordained women clergy in our church leading Wednesday Bible studies, and Rev. Lisa Rust preaching in worship.
- In September we held our **Mental Health for Today's Church** summit with 30+ attendees from our church, community, and other local organizations.
- Age group **worship celebrations** with Youth (March), Children (May), Friends of Jesus (October) and Senior Adults (November).
- Launched a **new "young adult" class** on Easter Sunday open to adults in various seasons of life from age 20"ish" to 40"ish". This group of approximately 15 has met on Sunday mornings, at participants' homes, held fellowship outings, and combined their efforts to serve others, such as blessing a local family's children with presents for Christmas.
- Multiple community-wide **fellowship meals** (Valentine Banquet, Shrove Tuesday supper, Palm Sunday luncheon, Friends of Jesus Softball game and cookout, end of Wednesday night cookout in May, fall ice cream kickoff, Christmas party breakfast with Friends of Jesus, kids Christmas program catered dinner).
- An **active Senior Adults** committee and group with many events on campus as well as various trips, including a week-long trip to Lancaster, PA & Amish Country in May.
- **Ecumenical worship gatherings** with fellow downtown Lumberton congregations including Holy Week services and the Community Thanksgiving service hosted here at FBC.
- A **summer of dynamic worship services** with various arrangements, formats, and locals! (Remember "in the round" and the chapel service)
- Our summer of **Living-Loving-Lumberton** with multiple Meet-n-Eats at local restaurants, social events, and recreational activities around our wonderful city.
- The **youth ministry engaged in highlight activities** such as a ski trip, wilderness trail hiking/camping trip, week-long camp at Passport Camps, music retreats, etc.
- Arts in August celebration of the many different artists and mediums represented in our faith community on display in the fellowship hall.
- Multiple **Book study groups** (June and December).
- A **busy Advent & Christmas season** with our annual Hanging of the Green service, various class & group parties, cantata, and our first-ever Spontaneous Nativity kid's program.

These are just a few things that I could recall to my mind, and I know there is so much more that could have been listed. We have a lot to celebrate and be thankful for in 2023, and also much to look forward to in 2024. So let us keep up the great work and continue living into our mission to be a "community of faith committed to living our the love of Christ by serving God and all people!"




