



#### Family/Child Dedication at First Baptist

#### What is it?

A dedication is a time for the child's family and the church family to promise to be present and support the child on his or her faith journey. We recognize each child to be a special gift from God, and as a church, we pledge to be Christian examples, good teachers, and to help the family as they guide their child in faith.

#### Why dedicate?

It takes a village to raise a child, especially when it comes to faith, and dedication is a time for the family and the church to recognize their responsibilities as part of that village. The family is promising to raise their child in faith and in a community of faith, and the church is promising to take an active role in that process. Dedications are also an opportunity to celebrate the child as part of our community of faith.

#### What happens at a dedication?

The family is presented to the congregation, and then a minister walks the child around the room to introduce him/her to the community of faith, telling the ways this congregation is promising to care for and love the child. Then, there is a brief litany for the parents and congregation to take part in, followed by the presentation of a gift and dedication certificate.

#### When do dedications happen?

We schedule individual dedications with families, and are willing to schedule on a Sunday that best suits your family's schedule. Popular dates for dedications are on Mother's Day or Father's Day.

#### Is there an age limit for dedications?

No. Families tend to dedicate children before the age of 1, but that does not disqualify older children. Some families start attending FBC after their child has reached that age and want to dedicate their child then. Others may choose to dedicate an older child with a younger sibling or after a significant family milestone (adoption, marriage, etc.).

#### Is this the same as infant baptism?

No. Our sister denominations (Methodist, Presbyterian, etc.) practice infant baptism as a way of placing a claim on the child's life by God and the church, with the understanding that confirmation will happen at a later date. The Baptist tradition reserves baptism for after one has made a profession of faith.
