## A Note from the Pastor's Desk December 2024

I recently was given a copy of a poem written by one of our former members. Her name is Loyce Bullard Stone, and she passed away back in 2006. While I of course never knew her, I am sure many of you did. The title of the poem is "STUFF" and I found its points to be personally enlightening. Given that we are approaching the Christmas season, I thought Loyce's words appropriate as we prepare our hearts and minds, hopefully recalibrating to focus on what is most important in our lives.

#### "STUFF" by Loyce Stone (80 yrs. Young) Lumberton, NC - Dec. 1999


