GIVING



During a recent staff meeting, we got on the topic of singing. Somehow, my cell phone was "listening" so I started seeing ads and notifications about music apps and emails about buying copies of music for the church. The information I received was actually somewhat helpful. The conversation was casual, but technology was listening.

I remember as a child going outside to play nearly everyday. On one particular day my grandpa, Bill Burney, (who lived next door) was out on the tractor bailing hay for his cows. I could hear him making sounds as the tractor was revving, but couldn't make out what he was doing. Slight panic (and some curiosity) came over me as I ran with my little bare feet to go check on what was happening. As I got closer, I realized my grandpa was singing. He was singing his heart out on that tractor, a whole lot off key sometimes, but it was beautiful. While I don't remember the exact song he was singing, I do remember it was a hymn. I told my mama what he was doing, and several days later when she asked him about it, he said he was making "a joyful noise to the Lord" (from Psalm 100:1). While he didn't know I was listening, he did know that the Lord was listening.

While I seemed to have inherited the Burney singing and musical talent genes (rather, lack thereof), I still enjoy singing to the Lord as an act of Worship. A whole lot off key sometimes, and I may not know all the words, but I sing. I sing often alone and during congregational singing during church. Either way, I know the Lord is listening and it is a beautiful sound ("joyful noise") to him. Even if you are like me and don't possess a beautiful singing voice, I invite you to still use your "noise" and sing because you know the One who is listening.
