
A Note from the Pastor's Desk March 2025



Lent has begun once again and today, at the time of my writing, it is Ash Wednesday. I've learned over the years that some spiritual practices are more meaningful than others, depending on the person and life's circumstances. For me, the day works like a reset button. It reminds me to be humble and acknowledge sin and death. I can see why it isn't something everyone leans into.

By the same token, people sometimes like to take shots at others for fasting or receiving the imposition of ashes. It is always interesting to hear from youth who choose to wear their ashes at school. They have some positive reactions and often a few negative comments, nearly always from other Christians. Other people minimize the importance of fasting for whatever reason.


This day is not a contest. Lent is not a competition. Please challenge yourself, talk to God, and do what you are capable of doing. Give what you can give cheerfully. Give up what you can give up and still function. Don't brag about either and please don't judge others in regards to what they choose to do.

We (the Youth Sunday School Class and the Young Adult one) have combined for a few weeks and are currently reading the book of Matthew for Lent. This week we will be covering the Sermon on the Mount. Someone recently pointed out that in the SOM Jesus says nothing about what to believe, only what to do and how to be. It was the core of what it meant to follow Christ. Three hundred years later, Christians came up with the Nicene Creed to define the faith. It is a list of things we must believe and says nothing of how to live. To me, Lent is a time to admit our sinfulness and seriously repent, for the kingdom of heaven is near.

Sanctuary/HVAC Task Force Meeting Recap

Members of the church's Deacons, Finance, Building & Grounds, and Endowment committees have come together to begin the work of having conversations around ways to address the HVAC issues of the sanctuary. During the February 23rd meeting, the following items were discussed:

- We learned more about the arrangement of our HVAC system, notably its piping that appears to go through portions of the ground. A quote from Townsend was presented for an estimated \$100,000-\$150,000.
- Concerns were expressed about the soundness of the structure and that an evaluation by a structural engineer was needed.
- A presentation regarding the amount of space we have vs. the space that is recommended given our active/realistic operating umbers was shared.

A request from the Task Force was presented to the Deacons February 24th and was approved to secure a structural engineer evaluation up to \$20,000. The next meeting for the Task Force will be announced once we get the report from the structural engineer.

We appreciate the continued investment of the Task Force in these important, although difficult, conversations. If you have questions, please reach out to the Deacons or to Rev. Josh Owens.

Lent: A Season of Reflection and Repentance

Remember the three pillars of observing Lent:

Prayer, Fasting, & Almsgiving

While Lent is not prescribed in the Bible, it has been a faithful practice of Christians for generations that has grown and developed as a way to more faithfully follow and remember the journey of Christ to the cross.

1. PRAYER/SCRIPTURE READING

Ways to Observe Lent

- Commit to observing a daily prayer in some form if you aren't doing so already.
- Choose to pray in a different way than you usually do. For example, rather than sitting in a specific place in your home, consider going for a walk and talking to God as you move.
- Engage in dedicated scripture reading
 - Use any 40-day plan and begin with Ash Wednesday and follow it every day (excluding Sundays) leading up to Holy Week.
 - Purchase a Lenten devotional book, or find one of the many freely published Lenten series available online. A few have been provided below from various partnering organizations.

2. FASTING

This has become a culturally popular association around Lent, however, it is a deeply spiritual practice observed by Jesus (Matthew 4:2). It is intended to help us re-enact the absence of something to remind us of what we ultimately need to be filled: Jesus. There are many ways you can go about doing this. • Another element of fasting that is limited to a handful of days is fasting from food on special days like Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Some traditions will fast the entirety of Easter weekend (Good Friday and Black Saturday).

3. ALMSGIVING (ACTS OF CHARITY)

So much of what we can do to observe Lent is personal, and done in isolation. This is one way in which we can observe the season outwardly, but it is with the intention of sacrificing something of yourself for others.

- Make special financial gifts to the church over-and-above your standard tithe
- Make a special gift (one time, or weekly) to one or multiple organizations
- Commit to volunteering so many hours each week of Lent to one of our wonderful local organizations (like Lumberton Christian Care) or to an area of the church you don't normally take part in.
- Offer to serve a neighbor or family member who you know could use assistance in some way in the coming days/weeks.
