

A Note from the Pastor's Desk May 2025

Every Sunday when we gather for worship, there is always a segment of the service where we collect an offering. One of the pastors of my childhood church, Rev. Dennis Guy used to say the offering collection was a time to "give back a portion of which God had given to us." You may have heard me utter that phrase in an offertory prayer a time or two as some things can become buried into our subconscious.

The act of giving an offering is an important one for many reasons. First, as Christians, giving of ourselves to God, including a portion of our financial resources, is a mandate of our Lord. In the Old Testament, there are multiple instructions for the people of God to give an appropriate amount



I mention all of this because, throughout the season of Lent, you may have noticed that our time of giving seemed different than prior worship services. Given the Lenten themes of sacrifice and giving up something for God, we moved the time in the service when the offering was collected from just before the sermon, to after. This was done for a few reasons. One, because usually, we speak about the offering being a response to God. Speaking of responsive acts, often we end the service by singing a song that encourages worshipers to act or respond to what they have heard God say through the Word proclaimed. This slight change allowed for the two common "responsive" elements of worship which typically were separate moments in worship, to come together in the service order. Second, it provided us a chance to use the themes of Lent to hopefully give greater focus on the purpose of why we give and what it means. Sometimes it may be easy to lose the significance of giving our tithes and offerings as an act of worship when it is sandwiched between the more expressive or engaging elements like singing or preaching.

So I wonder, did any of you notice the change? And if you did, were you focused just on questions like "Why are we changing what we've always done?", OR were you asking questions more like "What new ways may God be asking me to give of myself today in response to what I have heard?" Going forward in this Easter season and beyond, the time in the service where we physically pass the plates or encourage you to give digitally will once again reside in its more familiar location in the service. However, we don't want to lose focus on the importance of giving as an act of worship and as a response to what God has done and calls us to be. Rather than just assuming you know why we give, the goal each week will be to have a prompting to give, or a "call to give."

Our God expects us to give; give our money, our time, our attention, and our energy to Kingdom work both within our local congregations and the community around us. Our giving can and should be an act of worship, weekly and daily worship. So may we continue to think deeply about what we give, or maybe don't give, and consider how we can push ourselves to offer more of what we have to the glory of God's kingdom. For what we set our minds to, what we treasure most, that is where ultimately the focus of our heart will be also (Matt. 6:21).



Volunteers are needed in the following areas:

- 1. **Group Leaders:** Spend morning with kids of assigned age group, welcome them, and take them to various stations. Primary responsibility to know, love, supervise, and encourage students through the day! Must be adults 21+.
- 2. **Assistant Group Leaders:** Assist the group leader in carrying out duties. Open to any one over the age of 14.
- 3. **Celebration Leader:** Responsible for facilitating the opening and closing celebrations including songs, games, dancing, emphasizing the theme and theme verses. Ideally this person should be someone of high energy and have the ability to communicate effectively with little ones.
- 4. **Station Leaders:** Will facilitate a specified station session (craft, story, rec, or music). *Crafts: guide students in completing a themerelated craft.
- *Story: guide students in an intentional Bible story time by reading the text and asking questions.
- *Recreation: will prepare and carry out themerelated, team-based activities.
- *Music: will have an opportunity to teach a simple song, or use instruments that correspond to the them.
- 5. **Snack Coordinators:** Will ensure that we have acquired snacks and drinks for each student & volunteer, and help set-up, distribute, and clean-up snack.

6. Registration/Check-in

Coordinators: Primary role is to check-in students who have pre-registered and record any on-site registrations. These folks are some of the first faces seen so personable demeaners are desired.

7. Registration/Check-in

Assistants: Assist the Registration/Check-in Coordinators. Great opportunity for Youth.

8. **Floaters:** We can always use additional hands to ensure safety and security, assist in clean-up, and smiling faces to encourage participation of students. All ages are welcome to serve in this capacity.

From the pages of history... excerpt from the church bulletin December 18, 1927

"We often go to sleep doing the regular thing. God calls us to our best action in special campaigns—they bring us to prayer."
