## A Note from the Pastor's Desk July 2025

Each year, our congregation's denominational partner for missions and ministry, the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship, holds its General Assembly. This is when representatives from congregations (pastors or congregants), partner organizations, field personnel (missionaries), organizational staff, and other likeminded Christians gather together for business-related matters, worship, educational opportunities, fellowship, and yes, a little bit of fun. Some of my peers refer to it as the annual family reunion. I saw Sarah Boberg, former associate minister at nearby FBC Red Springs, refer to it as summer camp for adults! It is always an



inspiring and encouraging experience for me personally. It is especially an honor for me to travel and represent our congregation, and to tell folks across the Fellowship about the amazing work being done by the people of our faith community.

I thought I would share a brief recap of some of what I experienced so you have a taste of what our larger Baptist partnerships and the experience looked like.

- Participated in the Leadership Conversation, a special presentation with Dr. Ryan Burge, a leading religious sociologist and statistician (and pastor), about church participation and expectations for 2025 and beyond.
- Attended CBFNC's "meeting," which was a meal at a nearby restaurant. I was able to sit and talk with Matt and Michelle Norman, longtime CBF Field Personnel in Spain with NC roots. The



Normans recently became senior directors of field ministries, and next month I will be serving on Matt's ordination council in Leland, NC.

- Visited the Tuesday evening Welcome Party, where I was able to speak with representatives from various partners of ours, like Campbell University Divinity School, CBF Disaster Response Ministries, CBF Benefits Board, and many other schools, publishing houses, denominational services, and partner organizations.
- Attended "Late Night Worship," a special gathering led by CBF's Pan African Koinonia, which holds a service centered in the black Church experience.
- Attended additional worship services with spirited elements built around the assembly's theme of "You Belong Here" with sermons delivered by Rev. Melissa Hatfield (pastor of FBC Jefferson City, MO) and Dr. Paul Baxley (executive coordinator of CBF).
- These services also included experiences such as the commissioning of new CBF-endorsed chaplains and pastoral counselors, collections for the Offering for Global Missions, and communion.

- Attended the business session where multiple awards and scholarships were given out, retiring field personnel were celebrated, reports were given by various CBF entities, a new slate of leaders within the organization were voted on, the budget adopted, and a rousing address was given by the outgoing moderator of CBF, Rev. Juan García, pastor of Primera Iglesia Bautista de Newport News, Va.
- I attended two large luncheons. First, the Dr. Emmanuel McCall Racial Justice Trailblazer luncheon (as a guest of CBFNC), which celebrates racial

reconciliation work done by individuals and congregations in the Fellowship. Second, I went to the Baptist Women in Ministry Luncheon, where I shared lunch and conversation with Mina and Gennady Podgaisky, field personnel to Ukraine who are now serving on the Polish border ministering to refugees of the ongoing war in Ukraine. During the BWIM luncheon, the organization raised \$15,000 in



less than ten minutes thanks to the 600-plus attendees in the room!

- I attended two Learning Labs (workshops): one on fostering financial giving & stewardship with younger generations in your churches, and a second on moral injury and ministering with first responders that was led by a group of chaplains from the VA, Air Force, and Kentucky Federation of Fire Chaplains.
- I networked with a pair of younger ministers wrestling with ministerial transitions and was able to offer support for them, while also connecting with friends and peers who are a support and encouragement to me.
- Attended the St. Louis Cardinals vs. Chicago Cubs baseball game on Wednesday evening with about 500 other GA attendees.
- Found some good BBQ (in St. Louis, that means ribs), and ooey gooey butter cake!

Next year's gathering will be in Jacksonville, FL, June 17-19. It is free to attend the gathering itself, so I would encourage you to consider attending with me. Lord willing, I'll be there again next year!








#### **UPCOMING YOUTH TRIPS**
