The Longest Night: An Advent Memorial Service Sunday, December 21 5:00 p.m. in the Chapel

The Longest Night Memorial Service will take place Sunday, December 21st at 5:00 pm in the Chapel. This date coincides with the onset of Winter, a time characterized by the longest period of darkness in a day. The event is intended for individuals experiencing grief due to recent bereavement or any loss, regardless of the duration since the event. Candles symbolizing hope will be lit during the service, and a crocheted snowflake ornament will be provided to those who have lost a loved one within the preceding year. This keepsake serves as a token of God's comforting presence and tranquility.

Each month, we have a canned and dry goods food drive, but we need even more donations the coming month. While we usually focus on collecting items the first Sunday of each month, we gladly accept donations anytime. Suggested items include pop-top canned goods (soups, veggies, fruits), cereal, peanut butter, canned meats, pasta and pasta sauce, and toiletries (soap, shampoo, toothpaste, feminine hygiene, etc.). Bring donations to the church office or place them in the labeled bins around the church.

If you prefer, you may give towards our Community Assistance fund. This designated fund allows us to serve needs in our community through purchasing of food, fuel, hotel rooms, and other needs of folks who call or come to our door seeking assistance.
